Request for Information

I write further to your request FOI ID 46369 under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 regarding: -

Armed Forces Veterans – Open to Psychiatry, Local Government Area, Inpatients

Your request is set out below:

1. The number of Armed Forces Veterans registered with KMPT Psychiatry Services in the Kent and Medway Area, and required to take medication for their illness.

The Trust currently has 73 Armed Forces Veterans registered with an open referral or within an inpatient bed in the Kent and Medway area.

In relation to whether these individuals are required to take medication this information is not held centrally and is contained within the individual clinical records which cannot be extracted as a standalone piece of data. In order to extract the requested information and collate the results would require a manual exercise to identify and review clinical records and would exceed the appropriate time limits, as per the Freedom of Information Act 2000 section 12(1) which does not oblige a public authority to comply with a request for information if the authority estimates that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the appropriate limit.

2. The Local Government Areas in which Armed Forces Veterans are receiving treatment.

The Kent and Medway NHS and Social Care Partnership Trust are commissioned to provide the adult mental health care and treatment for the whole of Kent and Medway area which comprises of Kent County Council and Medway Council as Local Government offices. 3. The number of Armed Forces Veterans detained in KMPT Forensic, Acute and Older People's Wards as at 04 November 2024, including the Hospital in which they are detained.
