### 2025 deaths

b) How many of these deaths were reviewed, and how many were judged more likely than not to have been avoidable?

All information requested is not routinely collected outside normal record keeping of a clinical record. The requested information is not held centrally and is contained within the individual clinical records and archive systems which cannot be extracted as a standalone piece of data. In order to extract the requested information and collate the results would require a manual exercise to identify and review clinical records and would exceed the appropriate time limits, as per the Freedom of Information Act 2000 section 12(1) which does not oblige a public authority to comply with a request for information if the authority estimates that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the appropriate limit.

  - b) Please provide the number of deaths that were reviewed in this period (2023/24) where families and carers were involved and engaged in review.

We can confirm that of the 2025 deaths recorded, there were 73 where Duty of Candour indicated and completed. In relation to the remaining 1952 deaths it is not thought that there was an indication that Duty of Candour was required. However, in order to provide a response in relation to the remaining 1952 deaths a manual exercise would need to take place to review clinical and incident records and would exceed the appropriate time limits, as per the Freedom of Information Act 2000 section 12(1) which does not oblige a public authority to comply with a request for information if the authority estimates that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the appropriate limit.

- 4. Actions and Learning
  - a) Please provide a summary of all actions taken as a result of the learning from deaths process in the last reporting period.

The actions taken by the trust to improve learning from deaths process in the last reporting period include:

- Implementation of PSIRF and embedding practice across the trust
- Improvement of the Structured Judgement Review process trust wide. This includes training more staff to complete SJRs, where learning can be identified and actioned across the organisation.
- Implementation of the suicide prevention approach, with aims that include family engagement in the prevention of suicide, partnership working with our staff and external organisations and compassionate support to those affected by suicide.
- Development of a Clinical Risk Assessment and Management (CRAM) training for staff in risk assessment and suicide prevention to align with national guidance on risk assessment.

I confirm that the information above completes your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. I am also pleased to confirm that no charge will be made for this request.
